Thoughts for Your Meditation

It has been said that the phrase ‘*do not be afraid*’ appears in the Bible 365 times! That’s one for every day of the year. Whether or not it actually does appear this many times in the Bible, it still offers us hope, strength and courage when we are in doubt or struggling in any way. When Mary was called and chosen to be the mother of Jesus, we are told that she was *deeply disturbed and wondered what the words and message meant*. Immediately, she was encouraged with the words, ‘*Mary, do not be afraid*’. When Joseph heard that Mary was pregnant, he was going to divorce her quietly. But in a dream, he too heard these words, ‘*Joseph, do not be afraid*’. In each experience God called Mary and Joseph by their names and asked them to take on what seemed like an impossible task. But having been called, they were not to rely on their own strength and determination; God who called them would also strengthen, support and encourage them. They would never be alone.

Fear is part of life, and part of each of our own daily lives. We are afraid of many things; failure, death, violence, the rise of terrorism and religious intolerance in our world and in our country. There are so many forces in the world today that are in direct conflict with the message and values of the gospel.

Like Mary and Joseph each of us is called by name by God. We are called to be examples and witnesses of Jesus in our world today. In the gospel, Jesus asks us to declare ourselves for him in the presence of others. At times this can be difficult and challenging. The values of the gospel are often and generally not the values of the world. Through the quality of our daily lives and how we behave, we are to be the real and credible witnesses to Jesus and his gospel. We won’t be left on our own, Jesus will be with us. As Mary and Joseph were called and encouraged, so too will we be, with the words, ‘*do not be afraid.*’

Let us not be afraid of what is being asked of us. Let us not be paralysed by our fear. Instead, let the words of Pope Francis encourage us, “*go out again and again, without fear and proclaim the good news which is for all peoples*”.

Today's Gospel offers evidence of Jesus' divine power and authority as he calms the storm. Jesus' rebuke of the storm also echoes the rebuke he uses when he talks to and expels demons. In each situation, Jesus' power and authority is a sign of his divinity. Indeed, the disciples are left wondering about Jesus' identity at the conclusion of today's Gospel. They see before them a human being who acts with the authority and power of God.

This Gospel is a metaphor for our lives. We are in the boat, the storms of life are raging around us, and like the disciples, we may believe that Jesus is unconcerned, or “sleeping.” We hope that we will be as familiar with Jesus as were his disciples. If we feel that Jesus is sleeping, are we comfortable enough to wake Jesus and present him with our needs? Jesus does not chide his disciples for waking him. Instead he rebukes them for their lack of faith. When we bring our worries to God in prayer, we can be confident that he hears us.
