

FRUIT FOR THOUGHT ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

Symbolically, the fig tree was a favorite of the Jews. Genesis, the first book of the Bible, tells that it was the leaf of the fig tree that covered the nakedness of Adam and Eve after they committed original sin. The Book of Revelation, the last book of the Bible, compares the falling of stars from the sky at the end of the world with the falling of the figs from this tree.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the Parable of the Fig Tree (Luke 13: 6-9). In the story, we see the vineyard owner (God) expressing his disappointment at the fruitless tree. He has rightly looked for fruit for three years from the tree, and he justly decides to destroy it when he finds none. But the compassionate gardener (Jesus) pleads for a little more time to water and fertilize the fruitless tree. The vineyard owner (God) finally responds in patience and grants another year of life to the tree.

The lesson here is that borrowed time is not permanent. God's patience has a limit. In the same way, God in his mercy grants us another day, another hour, another breath. Christ stands at the door of each man's heart knocking and seeking to gain entrance and requiring repentance from sin. But if there is no fruit, no repentance, His patience will come to an end, and the fruitless, unrepentant individual will be cut down. We all live on borrowed time; judgment is near. That is why the prophet Isaiah wrote, "Seek the Lord while he may be found; call on him while he is near. Let the wicked forsake his way and the evil man his thoughts. Let him turn to the Lord, and he will have mercy on him, and to our God, for he will freely pardon" (Isiah 55: 6-7).
