

Fr. Jozef's unforgettable first audience with Pope John Paul in January 1983

What do you know about Saint Pope John Paul II? This Monday will be the 100th anniversary of the birth of one of the most famous and remarkable men of our times: Karol Wojtyla, later Pope Saint John Paul II. His life was marked by unusual difficulties. Born in a small town of Wadowice. His mother died in 1929, and his older brother, a physician, died in 1932. He lived in a two-room apartment with his father, on a retired Austrian Army officer's pension. After High school, he went to study Polish Literature at Krakow University, which, within 12 months was closed by the German Nazis, who invaded Poland on September 1, 1939. His father died in 1941. At age 20, Karol worked in a stone quarry under the forced-labor laws of the Nazi regime. At that time, he decided to become a priest and in 1942 began his philosophy and theology studies in a clandestine Seminary in Krakow. On February 29, 1944, Karol was struck by a German truck, but, unbelievably, a German officer ordered the driver to take Karol to hospital. There, he was treated for a brain concussion and lacerations to the head. He was ordained priest in Krakow on November 1, 1946. He continued his studies in Rome and completed his first doctorate in June 1948. He returned to Poland and was assigned as a parochial vicar in a small village. He also began teaching at the Theological School of Krakow University and later was a professor at the Catholic University in Lublin. On July 4, 1958, he was named auxiliary bishop and in 1964 became the archbishop of Krakow. He took active part in the Second Vatican Council (1962 -1965). In 1967, he was created Cardinal by Pope St. Paul VI. October 16, 1978, Karol Cardinal Wojtyla was elected Pope, taking the name "John Paul the Second." On May 13, 1981, he was shot in Saint Peters Square in Rome but miraculously survived the attempt. After a very busy and significant life as priest, bishop and pope, he died on April 2, 2005. He was canonized (declared saint) on April 27, 2014, by Pope Francis. The canonization Mass was concelebrated by: Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, about 150 Cardinals, 700 bishops, thousands of priests, and at least 500,000 people attending the Mass with an estimated 300,000 others watching from video screens placed around Rome.

THIS WEEK'S MESSAGE

Through the Risen Christ, we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit that fills us with hope and joy, even in the face of suffering. This same spirit showers us with a love and truth that is beyond "world" standards and wisdom. It is God's Spirit that transforms us from a mere collection of isolated individuals or strangers into a community of brothers and sisters. This solidarity, the fruit of the Spirit, "presumes the creation of a new mindset which thinks in terms of community and the priority of life of all over the appropriation of goods by a few." (*The Joy of the Gospel, 188*)




